Around the globe, communities are increasingly suffering from the devastating impacts of climate change, with already fragile regions often hit the hardest. Despite numerous pledges, international climate action remains too slow and unequal, including the shift to renewable energy. The energy transition itself comes with a great potential for disruption, for example regarding new dependencies in green energy supply chains. While the challenges of climate and energy security demand comprehensive multilateral cooperation, increasing geopolitical tensions pose major obstacles to joint approaches.

The current level of multilateral cooperation is also insufficient to meet the Sustainable Development Goals. Far below the 2030 targets and put under additional strain by risks of growing market fragmentation and weaponization of dependencies, new efforts by the international community are required to revitalize both policies and international institutions. To strengthen societal, political, and economic resilience a stronger emphasis on accountability and good governance, as well as concerted action against corruption and kleptocracy are needed.

With its Sustainability Program, the MSC aims to advance the debate at the intersections of governance, the environment, security, and prosperity. To that end, the MSC facilitates exchange between senior decision-makers and experts from different sectors. Activities include a variety of formats as part of the MSC's main conference, in-depth roundtables at Munich Leaders Meetings, high-level discussions at the margins of the United Nations Climate Change Conferences (COP), and MSC publications.
